### 2000 Honorary M Award BOB KALMBACH

**Bob Kalmbach**, U-M's chief photographer is probably almost as familiar a sight to many on campus as his photos. He has taken photographs of presidents, vice presidents, foreign dignitaries, musicians, athletes, and chronicled nearly every event on campus in the 45 years he has worked at the U-M.

Next to people, his favorite subject is sports. He's always been a sports nut. He's seen nearly every U-M football game since 1947. He equally enjoys photographing wrestling, gymnastics, field hockey, and all of the non-revenue sports.

Bob produces the face shots of the athletes in every U-M sport. That's about 600 photos a year. He probably supplies 95 percent of the black and white photos the Athletic Department sends out to the media each year.



### 2000 Honorary M Award JOYCE LINDEMAN

**Joyce Lindeman**, associate professor – Division of Kinesiology, and lecturer – School of Education, retired from active faculty status on May 31, 2000 after a most productive teaching and administrative career.

Joyce received her B.S. degree in 1954 from Eastern Michigan University and her M.A. degree in 1965 from the U of M. She joined the School of Education as assistant professor in 1968 and became associate professor in 1973 and coordinator of teacher education in 1983. In 1989 Joyce became chair of Sports Management and Communication and was named associate director for curriculum and instruction in 1991.

In addition to teaching many physical education courses, Joyce coached the U-M Synchronized Swimming team from 1972-83 and directed six water shows. Her teams consistently ranked among the top three in the nation. She coached and managed several national team tours to Europe and the Pan American Games, the 1989 Olympic Festival, and the 1990 Goodwill Games.

Joyce served multiple years as vice president for Olympic international, administration, and education for U.S. Synchronized Swimming from 1984-97 and is in that organization's Hall of Fame. Within the University, she served two terms on the Board in Control of Intercollegiate Athletics. She received Kinesiology's first Teaching Excellence Award in 1990 and was one of two faculty honored in 1995 with the Michigan Association of Governing Board's Distinguished Faculty Award.

Joyce brought about numerous innovations in the curriculum and in teaching technology and was an esteemed and dedicated mentor to both faculty and students.

**Paul Schmidt** enters his 18th year at Michigan and tenth year as Supervisor of Athletic Training.

A graduate of Fremont (Ohio) Ross H.S., Paul graduated from Ohio State in 1983 with a B.S. in physical therapy. He earned his master's degree in exercise physiology from Michigan in 1985.

Paul oversees the prevention, care and rehabilitation of athletic injuries for all Wolverine athletes. He coordinates a staff of 11 full-time,

**Dick Kimball** begins his 42nd season as the Michigan men's diving coach, a tenure which makes him the 'dean' among Big Ten Conference coaches. In the past 41 years with Michigan, Dick has helped the Wolverines to a winning percentage of over 800.

Dick himself a Michigan product, was a member of three consecutive NCAA champion swimming and diving teams (1957-58-59) while a student-athlete at Michigan, winning two national diving titles. He also competed on the Michigan gymnastics team as one of the nation's top trampolinists. Following his years as a Wolverine, Dick captured the 1963 World's Professional Diving Championship title, and finished runnerup at the World Acrobatic Diving Championships.

Selected as the 1988 NCAA Women's Diving Coach of the Year, Dick has helped coach Michigan's swimming and diving teams to their numerous Big Ten Conference titles and two NCAA Championship titles during his career. He has coached three Big Ten women's Divers of the Year: Diane Dudeck (1984), NCAA platform, one- and three-meter champion Mary Fischback (1988), and Carrie Zarse (1995).

Dick has seven Big Ten women's diving champions to his credit and nine men who have combined for 11 titles. He added Brett Wilmot to the 10-meter platform champion list in 1999 and Alex Bogaerts in 1996. Zarse was the 1993 Big Ten one-meter champion, the first Wolverine since Fischbach. Fischbach's 11 dive one-meter score of 520.50 in 1988 remains the conference championship meet record.

In addition to developing the nations top collegiate divers, Dick is committed to producing top-notch international divers. His Michigan and Kimball Divers programs have produced several Olympic competitors, including four gold-medalists: Mark Lenzi (1992 springboard), Phil

Boggs (1976 springboard), Micki King (1972 Springboard) and Bob Webster (1960, 1964 platform). Dick served as U.S. diving coach for the 1964, 1980, 1984, 1988 and 1992

U.S. Olympic Diving teams and coached an Uruguayan diver at the 1996 Olympic Games.

He also served as head coach for the 1985 World Student Games in Kobe, Japan, and was one of three coaches to head the United States diving team at the 1993 FINA Cup in Beijing. Throughout his career, Dick has taken competitive squads around the world.

The 1984 Olympic team traveled to China, while the 1983 Pan-American team competed in Caracas, Venezuela.

Dick has received numerous awards and honors recognizing his contributions to the sport of diving. He was presented the 1972, 1976 and 1992 Fred Cady Memorial award following the three Olympic Games for "sincere dedication in achieving the ultimate in coaching the sport of diving." He is a member of the International Swimming Hall of Fame and the Michigan Athletic Hall of Honor. Dick was the first diving coach to receive the Collegiate and Scholastic Swimming Trophy from the CSCAA in 1986. The Big Ten has selected him Diving Coach of the Year four times (Women's 1984-87-88, men's 1990), while the NCAA named him the 1984 men's and women's and 1988 women's Coach of the Year.

A native of Rochester, Minn., Dick was the Minnesota high school state diving champion four straight seasons. He received his bachelor's degree from Michigan in 1959 and his masters in 1960, with a secondary teaching certificate. Dick and his wife, Gail reside in Ann Arbor and are the parents of three adult children.

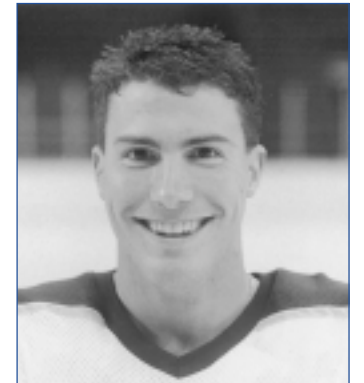

# Meet the New Board Members

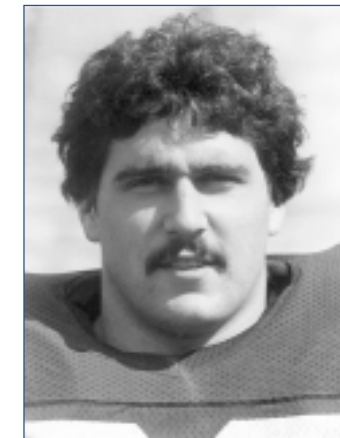
The following four individuals have been selected to serve on the "M" Club Board

## MEET THE NEW PRESIDENT AL RENFREW

Al Renfrew, an integral member of the University of Michigan Athletic Department as a player, coach and administrator, has been elected as the new Letterwinner's "M" Club president.

A native of Toronto, ONT, Renfrew earned four varsity letters as a high-scoring forward for the Wolverine hockey team from the 1945-46 season through 1948-49. In his four seasons the Wolverines were a combined and they won the first ever national championship beating Dartmouth in the finals in 1947-48.

Renfrew served as captain his senior season ('48-49) and led the Wolverines to a third place finish in the nationals.

Following his graduation from Michigan, Renfrew entered the coaching profession and was a head coach at the collegiate level for 22 seasons with stops at Michigan Tech (51-52 to '55-56) and North Dakota (56-57) before returning to Ann Arbor ('57-58 to '72-73).

In his 16 seasons at Michigan Renfrew's record was 223-207-11. His 1963-64 team collected Michigan's seventh national championship, beating host Denver in the title game.

Renfrew was the first person to play on a national championship college hockey team and later coach a national champion. His 1961-62 team, led by current "M" coach Red Berenson, placed third in the NCAA tournament.

Renfrew was inducted into the University of Michigan Hall of Honor in 1986 and is member of the Deker's Hall of Fame and the Deker's Legends of Hockey.

Al and his wife, Marge reside in Ann Arbor. They have two daughters, Judy and Debra, and one son, Mark.



## William C. Martin named University of Michigan athletic director

William C. Martin has been named director of the University of Michigan Department of Intercollegiate Athletics. The ap-

pointment was announced August 1st by U-M President Lee C. Bollinger. Martin has been serving as interim director since March 6.

The appointment will be for a five-year period. Martin, a U-M alumnus, is president of First Martin Corp., an Ann Arbor real estate development firm, and the founder and chairman of the board of Bank of Ann Arbor. Martin has indicated he will donate his U-M salary for the first year back to a special fund to benefit the Athletic Department.

The 17-member search committee chaired by U-M Professor James S. Jackson presented the names of three finalists for the position to Bollinger. Martin, who initially indicated he was not a candidate, was not among the finalists. Bollinger said he met with the three finalists and carefully considered each candidate, but came to the conclusion that Martin was the best person for the job.

"The search committee's work has been very important to this process," the president said. "They did just what I asked them to do, thinking deeply about the needs of the Athletic Department and looking broadly at all possible candidates. They presented to me three very strong finalists. However, they served in an advisory capacity to me and in the end, the decision was mine. I could not make this appointment with the confidence that I have if not for the committee's terrific work."

Bollinger noted that he has received a great deal of support from both within and outside of the department for Martin to continue as the permanent director.

"We have been incredibly fortunate to have someone with Bill's management experience, understanding of

sports and business credentials willing to accept this important responsibility," Bollinger said. "He has exhibited the leadership and vision necessary to see the department through its budgetary challenges while maintaining the athletic and academic excellence that is our tradition and aspiration."

Martin said the growing support for him within the department and his desire to complete a number of efforts he has begun led him to reconsider accepting the position. "I am excited by the challenge of serving as the athletic director at Michigan," he said. "We have a great group of coaches and staff, and I believe this is going to be a fun experience for all of us."

An avid sailor, Martin is president of the United States Sailing Foundation and also served as president of the U.S. Sailing Association, the national governing body of the sport of sailing in 1988-91. He has been on the board of directors of the U.S. Olympic Committee since 1995 and has served on its budget committee.

Martin earned a bachelor of arts degree from Wittenberg University, Springfield, Ohio, in 1962, and a graduate degree in economics from the University of Stockholm, Sweden, in 1963. He received his M.B.A. degree from the U-M in 1965. He has been a member of the board of directors of Wittenberg since 1994, and is a member of the Fales Committee of the U.S. Naval Academy.

In 1968, Martin founded First Martin Corp., a diversified real estate construction, development and management firm that has developed 35 major office, commercial, industrial and residential projects in Ann Arbor. He has served as president of the Washtenaw Land Conservancy since 1981 and also has been a board member of the Ann Arbor Public Schools Foundation and Washtenaw Technical Middle College, a charter school. He has taught courses at Muskingum College, Eastern Michigan University and the U-M School of Business Administration.
